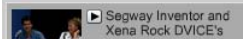
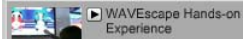

Hiding in shadows or using darkness for concealment won't do any good — not from the FLIR digital video cameras, which use heat rather than light to see in the dark. These cameras, which are based on the same sort of long-wave infrared technology that was used in movies including *Hollow Man* and *Predator*, is coming to home users. The cameras are already being offered as accessories for automobiles, including BMW's Five, Six and Seven series.

Home security options from FLIR begin at around \$3,400, and will provide a native 320 x 240-pixel resolution. That's a far cry from high definition, but it will be enough to know whether that sound in the backyard is really a potential cat burglar or just the neighbor's cat!
