An aid for night driving was showcased in a BMW parked at press event during CES, Lunch@Piero's. In this video, FLIR shows how a black and white image that requires no light at all, shows where objects emitting heat, like an animal darting across the road, can be seen in pitch dark driving conditions.

FLIR Systems, the world leader in commercial thermal imaging solutions, has four infrared cameras that make black-and-white TV video from heat, not light. The VSR-6 provides nighttime home security without intrusive and expensive security lights. The Navigator II lets boaters see other vessels, outcroppings of land, and hazards to navigation at night and in bad weather. With PathFindIR, drivers can see 5-times farther at night than with their high beams. The EVS3 Enhanced
